Meet 3 small & 3 large conures at opposite ends of the size spectrum

Mention conures and there's a good chance that jendays, suns or blue crowns come to mind. There's no doubt that these medium-sized conures deserve their popularity, but there are plenty of other conures that are as equally captivating. Check out these six conures — three big and three small — and sample their appeal.

Maximum Fun, Maximum Size

Painted, Green-cheeked and orange-fronted conures: Unlike the midsize conures, these three small conures fit nicely in situations where a larger conure just won't work out. Their little beaks can deliver a painful pinch and sometimes even draw blood, but they won't inflict the damage larger beaks can.
